New courtyard, pavilion going up on Magnolia Campus

When Thomas University students move into the residence halls on Magnolia Campus in August, they'll find an added feature waiting for their use. Thanks to the generosity of a couple of donors, the area next to the residence halls on Magnolia Campus will feature a courtyard with a pavilion for students to use. Construction on the pavilion began the week of May 27.

The courtyard will include a new upgraded beach volleyball court, picnic tables with sunshades, trees, sidewalks and a pavilion. The 25foot by 40-foot pavilion will feature a tongue-and-groove ceiling, a metal roof, stone columns, ceiling fans, seating and gas grills. The area will be a place for students to gather and enjoy time together. It will also be an ideal location for Student Activities' events such as cookouts and game nights.

"This new pavilion will be a great addition for our students," said Dr. Bob Bohman, Vice President for Student Life. "Because it will be located on the Magnolia campus next to the

The Veterans Services and Career Transition Center allows veterans the opportunity to connect with peers. Located in Room 102 on the Forbes Campus (just around the corner from the TU Library) the Center is a designated area where veterans can share experiences and enhance comradery with other veterans in our community.

Understanding the basics of FERPA

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) is a Federal law that protects the privacy of student education records. The law applies to all schools that receive funds under an applicable program of the U.S. Department of Education, including Thomas University.

FERPA affords students certain rights with respect to their education records. These rights include:

- The right to inspect and review the student's education records within 45 days of the day the University receives a request for access.
- 2. The right to request the amendment of the student's education records that the student believes are inaccurate, misleading, or otherwise in violation of the student's privacy rights under FERPA.
- 3. The right to provide written consent before the University discloses personally identifiable information

from the student's education records, except to the extent that FERPA authorizes disclosure without consent.

4. The right to file a complaint with the U.S. Department of Education concerning alleged failures by the University to comply with the requirements of FERPA.

FERPA gives parents certain rights with respect to their children's education records. These rights transfer to the student when the student reaches the age of 18 or attends a school beyond the high school level. Students who wish to authorize the release of their records to their parents or to anyone else, must complete the FERPA Student Authorization for Release of Records Form available in Hawklink under Academic forms.
