### Itinerary:

Tue, May 16 Depart the United States on your international flight from ATL.

Wed, May 17 Arrive TelAviv Airport

Your guide will meet you with a "THOMAS UNIVERSITY – TUTKU" sign. You will be welcomed to the Holy Land by our representative and taken to your hotel in the Jaffa area on the shores of the **Mediterranean Sea** for dinner and overnight. (D)

Thu, May 18 Tel Aviv

On your own (optional) sites to see in Jaffa/Joppa before dinner within walking distance of the hotel—Jaffa Old City (Flea Market, Visitor Center, Small museum about history of Joppa/Jaffa, Art display by local artist—Suspended Orange Tree, Simon the Tanner's House (significant for the raising of Tabitha by Peter), .Franciscan Church—St Peters (1888), Modern harbor on site of Jonah and the Whale. If possible, the newly excavated cathedral at Ashdod. (\*B, D)

Fri, May 19 **Tiberias** 

You will begin your day with a visit to **Caesarea by the Sea** (Maritima) where Paul left for his final missionary journey. You will then travel to Acco, one of the fascinating ancient cities in Israel. It is a beautiful city perched on the coast of the Mediterranean rich in history. Your focus will be on the Crusader period in Acco (also known as Acre). Stop at the Aqueduct on way to hotel if possible. Overnight Tiberias. (B,D)



Sat, May 20 Tiberias

Today you'll begin with a Boat Ride across the Sea of Galilee where you'll stop for a devotional service. You will then visit Kibbutz Ginosar where you'll see the ancient boat from the time of Jesus. You will continue Magdala where you will see the ruins of a synagogue from the Second Temple period, one of the oldest synagogues in Israel. Magdala was a fishing town that was mentioned in Jewish writings of that time as a major site during the First Jewish-Roman War at the time of the destruction of the Second Temple. From there you will drive to Nazareth for lunch, then to Zippori where you will see a Roman villa and other buildings from the Roman period with beautiful mosaics that are very well preserved. Zippori was one of the local bases of the Crusaders and you will see the fort and watchtower that they built there. Your final visit of the day will be to **Belvoir Castle**, built by the Crusaders in the latter part of the 12th century. You will return to your hotel for dinner and overnight. (B,D)

Sun, May 21 Tiberias

You will begin today with a drive to **Caesarea Phillipi**. You will visit **Capernum**, archaeological remains of Tiberias, a city that was important in the Jewish Wars, as well as during the Crusader period. This was the capitol of Galilee during Jesus' Life and where Herod Antipas (from Jesus' arrest and trial) lived. Visit the **Tomb of Moses Maimonides** (He is, for Judaism, roughly the equivalent of Martin Luther for Protestantism – one really shouldn't leave Tiberius without learning a bit about this Jewish philosopher. After your visit there, return to your hotel for dinner & overnight. (B,D)

#### Mon, May 22 Jerusalem

This morning you'll travel along the Jordan Valley with a stop by the Jordan River on your way to Masada, the amazing mountain-top fortress built by King Herod. This is the site of the final battle in the Jewish Rebellion against the Romans. After your visit there, you'll drive along the Dead Sea, stopping to soak in the Dead Sea. On your way to visit Qumran where the Dead Sea Scrolls were discovered. You'll finish your day with a drive through the Judean Wilderness on your way up to Jerusalem for dinner and overnight. (B,D)

#### Tue, May 23 Jerusalem - Bethlehem

You will spend the morning at the Israel Museum and also, in one wing see the Dead Sea Scrolls in the Shrine of the Book. You'll finish your day in Bethlehem where you will visit the Nativity Church and see Manger Square. As you drive to the church you'll view Shepherd's Field where the angels appeared to the shepherds to announce the birth of Jesus. Finally you'll return to the hotel for dinner and overnight. (B,D)

#### Wed, May 24 Jerusalem

Today's tour begins at the Mount of Olives where you'll see a breathtaking panoramic view of the **Old City of Jerusalem**. You'll walk part of the Palm Sunday Road to the Garden of **Gethsemane** where Jesus went with the disciples on the final night before his crucifixion. There you'll visit the **Church of** All Nations and the garden with its ancient olive trees. Next you'll walk through the Kidron Valley where you'll see monuments from Second Temple period that are mentioned in the writings of Josephus. You'll continue your walk to the City of David where you'll see the excavations still in progress: King David's Palace, and Hezekiah's Tunnel. The tunnel is 1750' long and was carved during the reign of Hezekiah in order to bring water from one side of the city to the other. You will walk through this tunnel—which may have water in it, so come prepared with water shoes and a flashlight! You will walk to the Davidson Center, on the southern side of the Temple area where you will see the excavations of the ruins from the time of the destruction of the Temple.

The **Southern Steps** there were the primary entrance to The Temple at the time of Jesus. After your visit there, you will return to the hotel for dinner and overnight. (B,D)



#### Thu, May 25 Jerusalem

Your day will begin today with a visit to the Temple Mount where you'll view the exterior of Dome of the Rock Mosque. You'll continue from there to the Pool of Bethesda where Jesus healed the crippled man. Church of St. Anne, a beautiful Crusader church, before you begin your walk down the Via Dolorosa. This traditional walk, following the path Jesus took to the cross, winds through the fascinating Arab market of today. You'll visit the Church of the Holy Sepulcher, and focus on the Crusader portion of that magnificent building. From there you will wind your way through the Old City to the Western Wall, the place most precious for Jews around the world today. Walk through the Western Wall Tunnel where you'll see the pavement of the streets at the time of Jesus. Also visit the Garden Tomb. (B,D)

Fri, May 26 **Jerusalem - Jericho** 

Jericho-- **Hisham's Palace** (One of the Moslem Desert Palaces – Amazing mosaics. Return to the hotel for dinner and overnight. (B,D)

Sat, May 27 Fly back to ATLANTA
