RN-BSN

If you are already an RN, earning your BSN is a wise career choice if you are looking for potential career advancement. Industry projections support the need for BSN nurses to meet the expanding professional roles of an evolving health care environment.

Thomas University offers current Registered Nurses an opportunity to earn their BSN or advance directly to an MSN degree while continuing to work. We understand the constraints of time and balancing your education with work and family responsibilities. The RN-BSN program can be completed in just 12 months. The program is totally online in 8-week modules.

RN-MSN

The RN-MSN degree program provides Registered Nurses (A.D.N. or Diploma in Nursing) an opportunity to earn a Master of Science in Nursing in just 2½ years, while maintaining an active nursing practice. Concentrations are offered in Nursing Administration or Nursing Education. The curriculum includes: 18 credits of BSN bridge courses, 24 credits in core MSN courses, and 12 credits in Nursing Administration or 12 credits in Nursing Education. The program is totally online.

MSN

For nurses looking to take their career to the next level, earning your MSN degree is a surefire way to do so. Committing to a master's degree program is a big step, but it can have a huge impact on your nursing success in the form of new opportunities, higher pay and additional responsibilities.

Thomas University's MSN program offers specialties in Nursing Education and Nursing Administration. These specialties are also available as Post Master's Certificate programs. The MSN program can be completed in two years. The program is totally online in 16-week modules.



MSN-MBA

An MSN-MBA degree can provide you with an opportunity to learn the business side of nursing or if you're interested in a broader role in the health care industry. A master's degree program will teach you about leadership, management, policies and finance.

Individuals interested in this route receive a MSN-MBA degree. Students are able to earn the master's degree with 54 credits. Coursework is designed to be completed in just three years. The program is totally online.
