

What to Pack – Rust Residence Hall

What to Bring:

- Face Masks
- Hand Sanitizer
- Computer and printer
- Power strips for computers/electronics
- Desk lamp
- Alarm clock
- Storage and organizing units
- Waste basket
- Movies/DVDs
- Sheets, blankets, mattress pad and pillows (**extra-long, twin beds**)
- Laundry basket and soap
- Clothes hangers
- Shower curtain & curtain rings
- Shower mat/rug
- Toiletries & Towels
- First aid kit
- Batteries
- Pictures from home
- Posters/personal decorations
- Sticky strips for posters (no tacks, nails, or screws allowed in walls)
- Calendar/planner
- Cleaning Supplies (to use for bathroom and everyday cleaning)
- School supplies

What to Share:

- Mini Fridge
- VCR/DVD player
- Stereo (do not forget the headphones)
- Dry-erase board (to put up on your door)
- Fan

What Not to Bring:

- Microwave ovens (Microwave ovens will be provided in the common areas)
- Air fryers
- Halogen lamps
- Candles
- Sun lamps
- Weapons (including toy weapons that look real)
- Decorative lights (Christmas lights, neon lights, etc.)
- Air conditioners
- Pets
- Illegal drugs
- Alcohol
- Toasters, Hot Plates, Coffee Machines, etc. (anything with open-coil heating elements)

- Fireworks

Any items that may be deemed threatening to the health, safety, and security of others
